



▲ ON A ROLL

For an unusual contemporary look, you can go wrong with roller blinds that are available in a variety of fabrics, colours and designs. You have the choice of fabrics that either gently filter the light or provide complete block out. The sheer version is often used in homes where there is room to be enjoyed, but there's also a need for light to be screened and privacy. Roller blinds can be installed on roll up units behind a curtain detail volume, as shown here. Design by Caidibids.



▲ CLEVER COMBO

This window treatment uses a combination of white wooden Venetian blinds to control light and London blinds in a sumptuous fabric to add softness and glamour. The richness of the overall look is complemented by mahogany rods. Design by Drummond Classics Interior Design.

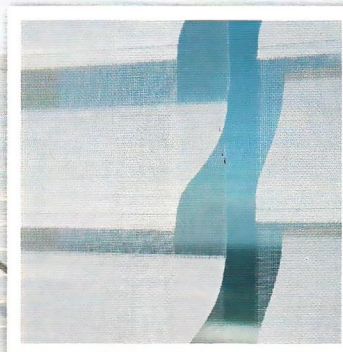

▲ TALL AND HANDSOME

The elegance of these tall bay windows is enhanced by classic Roman Blinds. The vertical wrap of the fabric accentuates the height. Adding a carry contrast is a pretty walling detail.

◀ TRANSPARENT MOTIVES

This innovative sheer wrap blind features a fabric that is suspended between two white wooden Venetian blinds in a way that resembles a Venetian blind and effectively filters light for comfort indoors. It works well for both small or large windows and doors. With a simple adjustment, different levels of light and privacy can be achieved and a further pull of the cord raises the blind completely into an elegant head roll.
